# ARCHIVES award

University Archivist Emeritus, Trent University

Bernadine’s support of the OCA archives stretches back to her work as the Trent University Archivist, and secretary of the OCA Archives Committee, from 1982 to her retirement in 2009.

During that time, she worked with various Chairs of the OCA Archives Committee, including Helen Stewart, to ensure that the records of the OCA were preserved, catalogued and available to researchers. Over the years, the archives at Trent have swelled to over 43 meters, or 140 feet of paper and records of organized youth camping.

In addition to the paper records, the archive includes oral interview tapes of individuals associated with camps and camping. This unique resource has been used by undergraduate and graduate students in geography, psychology and environmental students from around the world.

We recognize Bernadine for her immense contribution to the OCA and the archive, and the contribution she has made to the greater understanding of youth camping in Ontario .

Originally, camp offered both boys and girls sessions. Girls' camp was run under Ms. Comerferd, a Hamilton area teacher. However, in 1943, it was made into an all boys camp. At that time, many of the camp activities were sports oriented with a boxing ring and a wrestling match area available to work out camper disagreements. Fresh bread and pastries were made in the camp kitchen and milk was delivered by horse and cart from town. Ice blocks were kept in the icehouse to maintain perishables. There was one camp vehicle, which was used infrequently due to gasoline rations. Needless to say, Brébeuf has changed considerably since the 1940s.
