This award was created by the OCA Board of Directors to recognize the contribution of Dorothy Walter to the growth and development of the Association. It is the most prestigious recognition offered by the OCA. Dorothy passed away in December of 2006, however, her legacy of leadership lives on in the form of the good work done and fine examples set by the past and future recipients of this high recognition.

The award is presented, not necessarily annually, for providing outstanding service over a period of time. This outstanding service must include, but is not limited, to:

- Board and/or Committee leadership;
- workshop and/or Conference leadership; and,
- publication of articles regarding the field of camping.

## Award Recipient:

### Dr. Stephen Fine, The Hollows Camp

Stephen Fine founded The Hollows Camp in 1981 with his wife, Janet, and became an OCA Accredited Member in 1983.

Stephen grew up in Toronto and was somewhat of a nomadic camper. At six he attended day camp at the local YMCA and from that point on he was hooked. Throughout his late teens and twenties he continued in "extramural" camping adventures through seasonal wilderness trips and rock climbing outings.

However it was the family farm, located just north of Toronto, which was his grounding place of an enduring love of nature, interest in environmental studies and ultimately his focus on camp as an optimal setting for youth development. After 10 years of living and working out of downtown Toronto, Stephen and Janet moved to The Hollows, and what followed is a continuing narrative.

He emphasizes the ongoing need to encourage and sponsor our young counsellors at OCA camps to consider camp related issues when developing their theses or plans of study. Camp offers a rich mélange for in-depth study and encompasses a wide range of topics from health, business and education, to social, leisure and environmental studies. His hope is to maintain the momentum we have achieved and carry on with academic research into the phenomena of camp.

The OCA is honoured to present the names of camp leaders, who over many years, have trail blazed, built bridges and set precedents, which have assisted others in the Ontario camping industry. Honorary Life Award Nominees hold a place of special significance in the traditions and successes of our Association. New paths and bridges created and implemented by current camp professionals rest upon the solid foundations laid by these courageous pioneers. Honorary Life Members in our Association are a permanent part of our camp lives.

Recipients shall have met the following criteria:

- Ten (10) or more years of distinguished service in the field of camping.
- Held positions on the Board or have chaired committee(s), task force(s) or special project(s) for at least 10 years.
- Held an executive position of a camping organization or agency for at least 10 years.
- Retired from active service in camping or reached 55 years of age.

## Award Recipients:

### Jeff Bradshaw, Camp Wenonah

The impact Jeff has had on the provincial, national and international camping movement is significant. He is a community builder, tireless volunteer, mentor to many and a skilled leader whose career is highlighted by accomplishments and accolades.

Jeff's career in camping began in 1978; 1982 marked his inaugural season as a Camp Director. His professional experience includes work with Burlington Parks and Recreation and as Director of Camping for the YMCA. He served as Director of Camp Couchiching (including the Ontario Cystic Fibrosis Camp) and was the founding Director of the Couchiching Outdoor Centre. Jeff is currently the Executive Director of Camp Wenonah, which he founded in 1996.

Jeff currently serves on the Board of Directors of OCA (he previously served six years as Board Member). He volunteers as Co-chair of the OCA's Equity and Diversity Committee and the OCA Annual Conference Committee. He coordinated the annual OCA Skills Weekend, served on many OCA Committees and Task Forces and volunteered as a regular Standards Visitor for 30 years. Jeff is a two-term Past President of the Canadian Camping Association (CCA) and has served on the Board of the International Camping Fellowship for 20 years. Jeff has led workshops on five continents and is a long-standing member of the Society of Camp Directors.

The OCA recognized Jeff's contributions to camping by awarding him the Dorothy Walter Award of Excellence in 2006. He also received the highest honour in Canadian camping when the CCA awarded him the Ron Johnstone Lifetime Achievement Award.

### **Jill Dundas, Girl Guides of Canada, Ontario Council**

### **Joanne Dwhytie, Tapawingo: YWCA**

Joanne has spent her life in camping dedicated to the growth of girls and the mentoring of staff. She is a longtime camper herself, beginning with her first year at YWCA Camp Tapadoo and then continuing on at YWCA Camp Tapawingo from 1970 until now. She became the full-time Assistant Director at Tapawingo in 1985.

Joanne has a long-standing commitment to learning. She has obtained a B.A. from McMaster University, a B.Ed in Environmental Science from Queen's University and a Recreation Diploma from Humber College. She is also a Registered Massage Therapist. Prior to her full-time employment with YWCA Toronto, Joanne worked at The Ontario Camp Leadership Centre at Bark Lake.

Over the years she has held a variety of volunteer positions with the OCA working on the OCA Annual Conference Committee in 1981, 1982, 1986 and 1987. Joanne also served on the OCA Board in 1989 to 1990 as Aquatics Chair and more recently served on the Nominations Committee.

Joanne's volunteer contribution to camping led to her coordinating the volunteers at the International Camping Congress in 1983 and registration in 1994. She has demonstrated a lifetime commitment to camp and camping as a profession.

### **Janet Fine, The Hollows Camp**

Janet Fine is a founding member of The Hollows Camp. A theatre arts specialist, she studied at one of England's most prestigious theatre schools, the London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art (LAMDA), and holds an ARCT in Speech Arts and Drama from the University of Toronto.

Janet's camper years were spent at Camp Oconto where she found the perfect fit. Her love of riding began at Camp Oconto and continued as she eventually established a first-class riding program of her own at The Hollows.

After studies at LAMDA Janet had a successful theatrical career which included stage, film and television. As a member of the Shaw Festival Company, she spent many of her summers in Niagara-on-the-Lake, and throughout the decade, the Canadian stage gave her the opportunity to tour the provinces from B.C. to the Maritimes, and all points in between.

The creativity of the theatre was fine for a time but her love of the outdoors and camp was enduring. When asked if she misses her former life she says, "Absolutely not, what could be more creative and fulfilling than inspiring young people?" Janet believes that artistic self-expression through her drama programs at camp plays an important role in youth development by fostering self-esteem and communication skills. Like all things

She has been a speaker and/or keynote at member camps' staff training events and many conferences (Counsellor, Health Care, Provincial, National and International Camping Conferences). She is also a fellow of the Society of Camp Directors.

Kate is the founder and CEO of Vital Shift Consulting providing customized programs and training to clients in diversity, inclusion, leadership and transformation.



## Dave Newnham, Tim Horton Children's Foundation

Dave Newnham's career in camping began in an early age as a camper, and later a Day Camp Director with the Hamilton YMCA. Dave also spent his early residential camping career at YMCA Wanakita, progressing from summer staff roles to ultimately serving as year-round Assistant Director.

While studying Outdoor Recreation at Lakehead University, he spent two summers directing the City of Thunder Bay's Day Camps on the shore of Lake Superior. Rachel Kent has been working with Girl Guides of Canada (GGC) as a Camp Director for the last six years, working at Camp Adelaide and then Doe Lake Camp. She solidified Camp Adelaide's culture, creating positive camper and staff experiences. Doe Lake is GGC's largest camp and again, Rachel built the camp culture to be very camper focused; registration increased by 100 over the past two years!



Canadian Canoe Museum Summer Camps

Rachel worked extremely hard to change the camp culture towards inclusivity of staff with campers. She developed training for all of the camps around language and attitudes towards all campers. Something as easy as using the term “friends” instead of “girls” so campers who are working on their gender identity do not feel excluded or different from the group. She helped coach many staff to feel confident when campers identified as gender neutral. Many of the campers recognized each other as people with the understanding that everyone is different. She even dealt with a particularly challenging group of leadership campers who were picking on one girl and had them all change attitudes within a few conversations.

Rachel has also stepped up her involvement within the OCA. She was on the Annual Conference Committee this past year and found her voice to better discuss issues within Ontario camps. She helped welcome new delegates to the conference while being fairly new herself. Rachel has also been working hard on the Equity and Diversity Task Force, helping to make the OCA open to all.

This award is given to individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the international camping community through their leadership and their support of the camping philosophy.

## Award Recipient:

### **Jill Dundas, Girl Guides of Canada, Ontario Council**

Jill Dundas has been active in the camping industry since 1988 when she assumed the full-time role of Camp Director at Doe Lake Girl Guide Camp which she held until 1998. Currently she serves as Executive Director of Girl Guides of Canada, Ontario Council which provides camping experiences for over 30,000 girls throughout the year.

Volunteerism is an important part of Jill's support to the camping industry and it started with a supporting role on the Annual Conference Committee and then to multiple years as Annual Conference Chair, Vice President of the Board, program support to Kumbayah, Kids in Camp fundraising events and multiple other task groups/committees. Jill's contributions to the industry were recognized with the Dorothy Walter Award of Excellence.

In recent years she has extended her love and leadership in this field to the national scene as President of the CCA/ACC and to the international community as Treasurer of the International Camping Fellowship (since 2011). If that of treasurer were her only contribution in the ICF, it would be worthy of recognition. Jill has done much more for camping world-wide. She has moved the ICF through the process of by-law revision, business practice updates and coordination of member services. Jill has also been instrumental in the success of the last two International Camping Congresses (2014, 2017). On behalf of the Canadians in attendance she has coordinated the largest gatherings of Canadians at ICCs held outside of Canada. Leading up to Sochi Jill was the program chair for all of the international speakers as well as the ICF liaison to the Congress Committee. She is the Program Chair for Congress 2020 in China.

Here at home, Jill has been a gracious host and coordinator for international delegations attending our own OCA Conferences. In addition to the conference itself, she is always ready to assist these visitors to enrich their stay with additional camp and tourist visits. Jill is well known both here and abroad as a selfless and generous leader in the camping community.

### Tom Knowlton

Tom Knowlton has been a long-standing and loyal friend of OCA and, in particular, of the many OCA mentors who inspired him to follow his heart into education, camp leadership, storytelling and entertainment. In the later years of some of these

mentors (including Brian Blackstock), it was Tom's custom to inquire after, investigate and informally interview many of them. Tom learned from his mentors to never forget the journey that brings us to a place. His work will ensure that none of us will ever forget.

# WHAT IS THE STAMP OF A GREAT CAMP?

It's the Ontario Camps Association (OCA) Accredited Camp Member logo that our Members can proudly display on all of their camp materials, illustrating that they continuously meet industry standards with the utmost safety and care of your family in mind.

## WHAT DOES THE 'STAMP OF A GREAT CAMP' MEAN FOR MY FAMILY?

The Stamp of a Great Camp represents Ontario camps that parents can trust to be safe, educational and fun. With so many camp programs offered in Ontario, not all are accredited with the OCA. As a parent, it's your right to ask potential camps if they have the Stamp of a Great Camp, and you can check the OCA website to ensure their membership.

## WHAT TYPE OF CAMPS ARE ACCREDITED WITH THE OCA?

- Any and all camps that offer programs for children and adults.
- This includes day camps, overnight camps, camps run by private schools, camps run through churches, and other religious groups, additional needs camps, camps that run anywhere from one day, to eight weeks long, YMCA, municipality-run, Girl Guides and more.

## HOW DOES A CAMP EARN THE OCA 'STAMP OF A GREAT CAMP'?

- Camps must first work through a two-year provisional process before they can become fully accredited.
- All accredited camps must adhere to over 450 standards when they are visited every four years and evaluated by senior camp professionals of the OCA.
- These standards follow both federal and provincial legislature, as well as industry best practices, and cover all aspects of the camping industry including site, facility, health and safety, food service, water quality, program, transportation, management, staff hiring and training and more.
- When a camp adheres to these standards and guidelines it is a reassurance to all camp families that they are providing safe programs for their campers.

## WHY SHOULD YOU TRUST THE OCA'S 'STAMP OF A GREAT CAMP'?

- **REVIEWING AND REVISING:** The OCA is continually reviewing and revising the standards that camps must meet as federal and provincial legislature changes.
- **CONCERNS OR ISSUES:** After every OCA visit, camps are notified of any concerns or issues regarding the standards and are required to make the necessary changes before the next summer.
- **CRISIS HOTLINE:** Throughout the summer months (June – Aug.) the OCA offers all accredited camps access to our Crisis Hotline, which members can access for assistance with questions and support through a crisis.
- **RESEARCH:** The OCA offers accredited camps access to current research that is relevant and important to the camps industry, completed by the Canadian Camping Association and the American Camp Association.
- **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:** Throughout the offseason, the OCA offers accredited camps the opportunity to learn from and work with industry experts at several different conferences and workshops in order to better their camp operation.
- **INCLUSION:** The OCA assists accredited camps in working towards inclusion and accommodating campers with additional needs.
- **FUNDING:** The OCA provides resources to seek out financial assistance to eligible families wanting to send their children to OCA camps.
